New Zealand by New Zealander Peter Jackson, very popular.

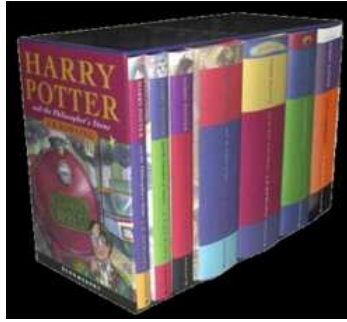

Harry Potter series

Harry Potter is a series of seven fantasy novels. The books chronicle the adventures of the adolescent wizard Harry Potter and his best friends Ron Weasley and Hermione Granger, all of whom are students at Hogwarts School of Witchcraft and Wizardry.



Muchamore, Robert Cherub series

Cherub is a series of young adult spy novels. The books centre around a division of the British Security Service named CHERUB, which employs orphans as intelligence officers. Recommended for those who have enjoyed the Stormbreaker series.

Tomorrow when the War began

The Tomorrow series is a series of seven young adult invasion novels, detailing a high-intensity invasion and occupation of Australia by a foreign power. The novels are told from the first person perspective by the main character, Ellie Linton, one of a small band of teenagers who wage a guerrilla war on the enemy soldiers in their fictional home town of Wirrawee. After reading these you should move on the Ellie chronicles and the DVD of the first book will be available when released.

The Chronicles of Narnia

A series of seven fantasy novels for children. It follows the adventures of Peter, Susan, Edmund, and Lucy, four middle-class children sent to safety in the English countryside during World War 11.



Snickett, Lemony

A Series of Unfortunate Events

A series of thirteen books with the themes of fantasy, horror and quiet quirky! Violence and a cynical, rather

sophisticated humor dominate. The books have been credited with helping to ease American children through post 9/11 anxieties by offering up the stark, rather adult truth that, no matter what dreadful things life throws at us, we must step up and deal with them. The author is in fact Daniel Handler who created the mysterious author Lemony Snicket, also a character in the books.

Artemis Fowl

Theme: Adventure, Fantasy, Science fiction.

Starring a teenage criminal mastermind named Artemis Fowl II. Artemis Fowl, the main character, is a ruthless and extremely intelligent young (human) criminal whose main goal is the acquisition of money through a variety of often illegal schemes. There are many settings in the series, including Siberia, Chicago, Taiwan, Morocco, France and various places in Ireland. One main setting that has been in all the books is the Lower Elements.
