## eBooks are embraced by Southland users

Do you have an eReader on your Christmas wish list this year? If so, you will be excited to learn about the enhancements we are offering to our fledgling eBook service, the South Island Downloadable Zone (powered by OverDrive).



Invercargill City Libraries is now live with OverDrive Advantage. This means we have purchased titles exclusively available to Invercargill library members to go along with the shared titles already available to South Island consortium members.

We have added some Non Fiction, Young Adults, and Children's eBooks as well as some more Adults' Fiction. We have also added a few more MP3 eAudiobooks for your listening pleasure. More titles will be added to the collection over time, so make sure you check back regularly.

To ensure you can see everything you are entitled to, please make sure you sign in as soon as you visit the Downloadable Zone. Whenever you see the orange tick symbol, you will know that this is an Advantage title.

Another enhancement to the South Island Downloadable Zone is the addition of a separate collection of 23 000 public domain eBooks which are always available, never expire, and do not count towards your 5 item limit on OverDrive. These Project Gutenberg titles include works by Jane Austen, Charles Dickens, Mark Twain, the Brontës, Bram Stoker, Tolstoy, Sir Arthur Conan Doyle, and many, many more. There is also the odd New Zealand title, such as *The garden party and other stories* and *In a German pension* by Katherine Mansfield, and *Station life in New Zealand* by Lady Barker.

To access these books through OverDrive, click on the image towards the bottom of the page (as pictured below). Instructions for downloading these titles can then be found at the top of the page. You do not need to be signed in to access these titles, and they are multi-user, meaning they are always available for you to download. They do not expire from your account, so are yours to keep. Explore some classics today and find your old favourites or discover some new ones.

Please note, as this is separate collection of eBooks, they will not appear in your usual OverDrive search results. You must click on the "Additional eBooks" image to search that collection only.

So, have fun exploring the world of eBooks and eAudiobooks that OverDrive offers, and feel free to contact us with any questions about the service that you cannot find an answer to on the website, and we will do our best to help.

# Delving into the Databases

## Database of the Month: Literature Resource Centre

As this title suggests – this database is dedicated to “literature”.

The database documents are themed around adults, children’s, popular and scholarly literature.

The database content consists of:

- Biographical essays
- Book reviews
- Full-text articles, poems and short stories
- Links to editorial selected websites
- Overview essays

The front page is uncluttered for ease of use. Five tabs allow you to choose your search method – basic, advanced, person, works search and Gale library Index.

You can limit your results by choosing peer-reviewed, publication dates and century, content type and publication title.

Your results will be displayed in six tabs:

- Biographies
- Literature criticism
- Multimedia
- Primary sources & literary works
- Reviews & news
- Topic & work overviews

Once you click on a result tab and choose an item from the displayed list the following tools are available:

- Citation
- Download
- Download MP3
- Email
- Print preview
- View PDF pages

You also have a listen option that you can click on and a translate feature that has lets you choose from a dropdown list of 12 languages.

Does it have New Zealand content you ask? Why, yes it does. For example there is content on Dan Davin, Janet Frame, Katherine Mansfield, Margaret Mahy, Maurice Shadbolt and Witi Ihimaera to name a few.

This database is an excellent tool for finding lists of author’s works and how they were received by their audiences.

You can also search for authors who were:

- Female or male
- From different countries
- From various backgrounds
- Writing at a certain time

Literature Resource Centre is a real treasure trove waiting to be tapped into. Take some time to have a look around this comprehensive storehouse of information.

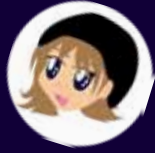

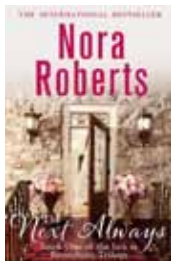

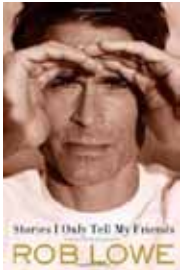


# Staff Book Reviews



## Stories I only tell my friends: the autobiography

Rob Lowe



Actor (and now author) Rob Lowe gives us the low-down on his career in show biz. A teen idol at age 15, a member of Hollywood's "Brat Pack" at age 20, and now a top star and talented producer – Rob Lowe has appeared in an impressive list of movies, TV series and theatre productions. In this carefully worded memoir, Lowe describes the film industry and the stars he has been associated with over the years. He talks about the wild excesses of the eighties, his battle with the bottle, and sets the record straight on that incident with the two underage girls.

Written in the present tense, *Stories I only tell my friends* is filled with little glimpses into Lowe's successes, a few career disappointments, some humorous escapades, as well as some insights into his personal relationships. When I say that this book is carefully worded, it is because I sense that he is always holding a little bit back. But then, as he is only 48, he still has a big future ahead of him in Hollywood and it may not pay to burn any bridges. A thoroughly good read, very entertaining. *Reviewed by Jill.*

## Storm front

Jim Butcher

I have only just discovered the fantastic series called the Dresden Files. *Storm front* is the first in the series and introduces readers to Harry Dresden, Wizard for hire. Harry lives in the ordinary world and once he has assured potential clients that he actually is a proper white wizard and his Yellow Pages ad is not a joke, helps people find lost things, conducts paranormal investigations, and gives advice. He also occasionally consults for the police department when they need help with inexplicable cases. In this case, people keep turning up dead in ways only magic could possibly explain and the police reluctantly turn to Harry for help. Meanwhile, a mysterious woman looking for her husband contacts Harry. Harry also has to contend with a beautiful reporter hounding him for either his body or a juicy story (Harry hopes the former!), and the White Council (who police the wizarding world) who are just waiting for Harry to trip up so they can carry out the ultimate punishment.



I found this book really engaging – very (darkly) funny in parts, and fast-paced and exciting enough to keep me on the edge of my seat. Sure, this book involves wizards and other supernatural beings, but they are anchored in the real world, and there are not enough Fantasy-type elements to scare off a generally non-Fantasy reader like myself.
